Construction update Yeronga station

In July 2021, UNITY Alliance opened a temporary pedestrian overpass over the rail corridor and demolished the timber and concrete pedestrian overpasses. During August, Cowper Street at Fairfield Road, will be temporarily closed for approximately six months to enable construction of the new pedestrian overpass over Fairfield Road connecting to the upgraded Yeronga station.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday, during August 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Temporary closure of Cowper Street at Fairfield Road for approximately six months (please see map overleaf) from late-August 2021 to enable construction of the new pedestrian overpass. This includes installation of temporary fencing around the work area. A further update will be provided closer to the closure date
- Continuing platform retaining wall construction
- Continuing piling on platforms 1 and 2 for platform foundation works, and installation of platform concrete
- Identification and relocation of public utilities (water, sewer, communications and electrical)
- · Track and maintenance work between Yeronga and Fairfield stations.

Out of hours work

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

		Station platform earthworks.

Please note that Yeronga station is now closed as part of an accessibility rebuild. To support customers during the closure, StationLink route 109 now running between Moorooka and Boggo Road stations.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Temporary closure of Cowper Street at Fairfield Road until early 2022 (refer to map 1 above). Access to Cowper Street will be maintained via Shottery Street. Traffic control and local road diversions will be in place. Please observe signage and traffic control to safely navigate through the area.
- Intermittent traffic changes on Fairfield Road between Kadumba Street and Yeronga Street for crane operations (refer to map 2 above). Fairfield Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction. During these intermittent changes the StationLink bus stops on Fairfield Road will be temporarily relocated. Please observe signage and traffic control to safely navigate through the area.
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators with hydraulic hammers, frontend loaders, mobile cranes, vacuum trucks, concrete trucks, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- · Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment
- Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.

We appreciate your patience during construction and will continue to update you as work progresses.
