

Description of works being undertaken

During the extended station closure, the following works will occur, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- ◀ Reconstruction of platforms 1 and 2 to improve accessibility, and construction of a third platform
- ◀ Installation of new shade covers and new station furniture (e.g., seating, bins, etc.)
- ◀ Construction of new platform retaining walls
- ◀ Construction of a new pedestrian overpass including stairs and three lifts
- ◀ Reconstruction of the car park to include a turnaround facility, provision for kiss 'n' ride and accessible parking
- ◀ Relocation of in-ground services
- ◀ Construction of a new enclosed bicycle storage shelter (capacity for 40), footpaths and landscaping
- ◀ Installation of CCTV, signage, lighting and ticketing facilities.

Why close Rocklea station?

- ◀ The extended station closure will mean the work gets done as quickly as possible
- ◀ All works will be completed during the closure, so the station will be fully accessible and operational when the station reopens (construction and weather conditions permitting).

What to expect

During the station closure you may notice some disruptions such as:

- ◀ Temporary traffic changes on Brooke, De Hayr and Station Streets. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists
- ◀ Temporary closure of the park 'n' ride for the duration of works
- ◀ Temporary removal of some on-street parking along Brooke Street for the duration of works
- ◀ The pedestrian bridge and footpath over the rail corridor between Brooke Street and Railway Parade will be closed. Visit crossriverrail.qld.com.au for alternative options and follow the signs displayed at the site
- ◀ Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- ◀ Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment including:
Light vehicles, trucks, excavators (with hydraulic hammers), frontend loaders, mobile cranes, vacuum trucks, power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers.

Alternative transport options

There are plenty of alternative travel options to support you during the closure.

By bus

- ◀ The high frequency **StationLink route 109** will be available from the Brooke Street bus stop. StationLink is an all-stops service between Rocklea station and the PA Hospital busway station.
- ◀ If you live on the eastern side of the station, routes 598 and 599 from Muriel Avenue provide a connection every 30 minutes to and from Salisbury station, and other local suburbs.

By train

- ◀ If you prefer to continue travelling by train, Salisbury and Moorooka stations remain open to customers. Salisbury station also has park 'n' ride facilities for those wishing to drive and catch the train.
- ◀ If you need an accessible station, Yeerongpilly and Coopers Plains are the closest stations with lift access.
- ◀ There may be other local services that are better for you, so remember to plan ahead before you travel.

Pedestrian access

- ◀ Pedestrian access between Railway Parade and Brooke Street will be via Heaton Street (under Beaudesert Road).



StationLink - Route 109

To support customers during the closure, StationLink route 109 will operate between Rocklea station and the PA Hospital busway station.
