Construction update Yeronga station

During August 2022, UNITY Alliance installed structural steel and pre-cast concrete panels for the new pedestrian overpass stairs and lifts. In September, construction of the new pedestrian overpass will finish and the bridge will open to the public (stair access only).

Works at Yeronga station are progressing, and the station is currently on schedule for completion late 2022, weather and construction conditions permitting.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during September 2022, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Completing construction of the new pedestrian overpass including the installation of screens, roof lining and services (e.g., lights) ready for the bridge to open in late September. Please note access to the bridge will be via stairs only, the lifts will open in late 2022
- Continuing electrical services installation and drainage works
- Continuing construction of station buildings on platforms 2 and 3 including roofing, ceiling installation, internal fit-out (e.g., services), concreting platform end walls and steel stair installation at the end of platforms
- Continuing excavation for services installation and landscaping near the Lake Street entry.

Out of hours work

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

Yeronga station	Nightly between 10:00pm and 4:00am Monday 19 to Friday 23 September 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery of construction materials and equipment into the rail corridor for lifts and buildings • Installation of overpass screens and glazing, service conduits and pits, lighting and CCTV poles • Canopy roofing and painting.
Fairfield Road and Park Road, Yeronga	Between 8:00pm Sunday 11 and 5:30am Monday 12 September 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Relocation of Fairfield Road StationLink route 109 bus stops (removal of temporary shelter and signage) to Park Road near Dublin Street (see map overleaf).
Yeronga station	Nightly between 10:00pm and 4:00am Monday 26 to Friday 30 September 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery of construction materials and equipment into the rail corridor for lifts and buildings • Installation of screens and glazing, canopy roofing and canopy painting.

Work locations and intermittent traffic changes, Yeronga station



What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Temporary closure of Cowper Street at Fairfield Road until late 2022 (refer to map above). Access to businesses River City Cycles, Brisbane Stickers and Aloe Vera Australia will be maintained via Shottery Street. Please observe wayfinding signage and traffic control to safely navigate the diversion
- Intermittent single lane closures on Fairfield Road between Kadumba Street and Yeronga Street. Please observe signage and traffic control to safely navigate through the area
- Intermittent temporary closures on Lake Street between Killarney Street and Christensen Street
- Intermittent construction vehicle access into the rail corridor via Dublin Street
- Light vehicles, trucks, excavators with hydraulic hammers, front end loaders, mobile cranes, vacuum trucks, concrete trucks, concrete pump trucks, concrete scabbling/grinding, bored piling rigs, high-pressure water cleaners, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment.
