Construction update Yeerongpilly station

During June 2023, UNITY Alliance will be undertaking early works activities in the rail corridor around at Yeerongpilly station. These works will include site investigations, installation of overhead electrical line foundations and signalling relocation works.

Major construction at Yeerongpilly Station is planned to commence in the coming months and detailed information will be provided before work starts.

Out of hours work

Works during June will be undertaken outside of normal construction hours when trains are not operational as outlined below:

Landscaping will be reinstated at the station as part of station works. Site survey and inspections within the rail corridor.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Access into the rail corridor will be via the Queensland Rail gates on Wilkie Street, Yeerongpilly
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators (with rock hammers), trucks, vacuum truck, concrete trucks, concrete pump truck, loaders, chainsaws, woodchipper, small power tools, and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment.

Cross River Rail won't just transform Brisbane, it will transform the way we travel across South East Queensland.
