July - August 2023

Construction update Salisbury station

During July and August 2023, UNITY Alliance will be undertaking early works in your local area as part of the Cross River Rail, Salisbury station accessibility upgrade.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during July and August 2023, weather and construction conditions permitting:

Tree clearing on Dollis Street along the rail corridor fence line from Saturday 1 to Sunday 2 July 2023, construction
and weather conditions permitting, to make way for new infrastructure which will be delivered as part of the
accessibility rebuild (please refer to map overleaf).

Out of hours work

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

Salisbury station and rail corridor	Between 12:00am Saturday 1 and 3:00am Monday 3 July 2023	Installation of overhead electrical line footings and masts
	Between 2:00am Saturday 15 and 3:00am Monday 17 July 2023	Excavation (including the use of vacuum trucks) and removal of material for service location and soil sampling
		Cable service relocation including trenching and installation
	Between 6:00am Saturday 29 and 10:00pm Sunday 30 July 2023	Installation of under track crossings (conduits) for services (e.g., electrical)
	Between 6:00am Saturday 19 and 10:00pm Sunday 20 August 2023	Drainage and service identification and installation works.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- A single lane closure on Fairlie Terrace and Dollis Street to access the rail corridor (please see map overleaf). Traffic control and signage will be in place to direct motorists, pedestrians and cyclists around work areas
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators (with rock breaker), bobcat, vacuum trucks, soil sampling
 drill rig, concrete trucks, concrete pump trucks, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile
 lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Increased levels of noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment
- Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.

Cross River Rail won't just transform Brisbane, it will transform the way we travel across South East Queensland.
