## UPDATED: Rocklea station construction

During December 2023 and January 2024, UNITY Alliance will continue service relocation works, overpass fit out, installation of station lifts and access stairs, drainage works, retaining walls and platform construction.

### Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during December 2023 and January 2024, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Continue construction of inground services including excavation for drainage and installation of water main protection (e.g., concrete casing), conduits and pits near the Brooke Street station entry. This work will require a temporary single one-way traffic arrangement on Brooke Street to allow for safe working area (please refer to map over page)
- Continue installation of station platform canopy steel, formwork and concreting
- Continue fit out of the new pedestrian overpass and lifts including electrical, lighting and flooring
- Installation of access stairs structural steel and fit out
- Continue installation of building services and fit out.

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

### What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Temporary single lane closure on Brooke Street, with one-way traffic arrangement from De Hayr Street to Annie Street
- Trucks and machinery including loaders, excavators with jackhammers, vacuum trucks, concrete trucks, pump trucks, mobile cranes, saws, small power tools, minor vibrating equipment, and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local areas such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Increased noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment.

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We appreciate your patience during construction and will continue to update you as work progresses.

## Old Queensland Rail Shelter

In September 2022, the existing shelter at Rocklea was carefully removed from platform 1 and safely stored until further investigations were undertaken. The waiting shelter was reconstructed circa 1950 due to fire damage.

After an extensive assessment of the shelter by an independent heritage advisor, it has been determined that due to the extensive and irreparable damage – decay and termite damage to floorboards, weatherboards and walls – the shelter cannot be repaired and reinstated at the station.

UNITY Alliance will now salvage elements of the existing shelter and incorporate them into a new replica shelter to be built by Constructionarium participants and reinstated at Rocklea station.

Constructionarium Australia is a non-for-profit organisation that helps the next generation of infrastructure, engineering and construction professionals gain skills by working on a real construction project. This is an exceptional opportunity for young professionals to develop practical project development, leadership and team skills.

The existing shelter will be removed from site in coming months once items have been salvaged. Information around the Constructionarium program will be made available shortly.
