Construction update Yeerongpilly rail corridor

In September 2025, works will be undertaken adjacent to and within the rail corridor between Yeerongpilly and Moorooka stations during a scheduled track possession. Train services are operating from the island platform (platforms 2 and 3) with the new third platform (platform 1) to open at a later date. Some intermittent construction works are continuing in the rail corridor.

Details of works

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday in September 2025, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Under bore drilling works adjacent to the rail corridor on the corner of Wilkie Street and Station Road
- Overhead electrical line removal and installation works, removal and installation of electrical bonds
- V-drain construction within the rail corridor including earthworks and concreting.

Out of hours work

Work activities scheduled during planned track possessions (when trains are not operating) or outside the project's standard working hours are outlined below, weather and construction conditions permitting.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some disruptions such as:

- From Saturday 20 September to Sunday 12 October, intermittent single-lane closures will be in place on Wilkie Street, between Station Road and Livingstone Street to support ongoing works
- Trucks and machinery including concrete trucks and pumps, frontend loaders, excavators with rock breakers, vacuum trucks, piling rig, mobile cranes, small power tools, minor vibrating equipment, generator to power mobile site offices (day and night) and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night.
- · Increased noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment.

We appreciate your patience during construction and will continue to update you as work progresses.
